Linda McCartney
1941-1998

Linda Eastman McCartney was the second-eldest of four children and was raised in a wealthy New York family. She studied Fine Art at the University of Arizona where she met her first husband, John See. They married in 1962, had one daughter, Heather, and then divorced in 1965. After that, she started to work for the Town & Country magazine and managed to be the only unofficial

photographer who was allowed to take pictures of The Rolling Stones during a record promotion party. From then on she photographed famous musicians that included Aretha Franklin, Jimi Hendrix, Bob Dylan, Janis Joplin, Eric Clapton, Simon and Garfunkel, The Who, and The Doors. In 1968, she photographed Clapton for Rolling Stone magazine, making her the first woman to have a photo on its front cover. In 1974, Linda and Paul appeared on the front cover of Rolling Stone making Linda the only person to have photographed, and to have been photographed, for the magazine cover. Her photographs were later exhibited in over fifty galleries internationally. Linda met Paul McCartney in May 1967 at a concert in London and they met again four days later for the Beatles promotional party for the Sgt. Pepper's album. After that assignment, Linda flew back to New York City. A year passed, Paul came to New York, saw Linda again, and asked her to join him in London. They were married six months later in a small civil ceremony. By then, Linda was four months pregnant with their first daughter, Mary. Linda and Paul had three children together, and Paul adopted Heather. After the breakup of the Beatles in 1970, Paul taught Linda to play keyboards and included her in the lineup for his new group, Wings. The group garnered several Grammy awards for their music, becoming one of the most successful bands of the 1970s. The McCartneys shared an Oscar nomination for the "Live and Let Die" song they co-wrote. Linda introduced her husband to vegetarianism in 1975, published two vegetarian cooking books and introduced a line of frozen vegetarian meals which made her independently wealthy of her husband. Linda was diagnosed with breast cancer in 1995 and it quickly spread to her liver. With Paul at her side, she died at age 56 at the McCartney family ranch in Tucson, Arizona. She was cremated in Tucson, and her ashes were scattered at the family farm in England. Linda left her entire fortune in a trust to be handled by McCartney who donated \$1,000,000 of it to the Arizona Cancer Center in Tucson where Linda received treatment.
